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#### From the desk of Jim Perras



#### Greetings,

The 2020 legislation session is now upon us. This is what is commonly known as the 'short session' lasting from February to May. Though the short session was originally intended to only allow for necessary budget adjustments in the second year of the biennium, it has in practice, become a

sprint to pass into law any and all policy initiatives technically reserved for a normal session. The result is that the sausage is made at breakneck speed with little regard given to hygiene or byproducts. This makes our involvement and vigilance even more important as good intentions often lead to unintended consequences in the short session.

### This session, our Government Affairs Committee has decided to focus on two proposals.

- 1. First, we will once again be advocating for the modernization of the Zoning Enabling Act CGA 8-2. Our intent is to make 8-2 easier for lay people, including municipal zoning officials, to understand. It is no secret that the convoluted state of this statute is a large reason why Connecticut has more land use attorneys per capita than any other state. In addition, our proposal would clarify and reinforce existing municipal reporting requires. It would remove the "character of the community" as a basis for denial which often leads to discriminatory zoning decisions. Lastly, it would create an advisory group that would create guidelines and incentives for municipal compliance.
- 2. We are also seeking a study of the financial benefits to moving Connecticut to a six-year code adoption cycle. We are confident that an unbiased study will conclude that lengthening the code adoption cycle will provide economic benefits to consumers, state and municipal government and our industry. In doing so, it will help to gain wide ranging support and pave the road for implementation of a six-year code adoption cycle in the 2021 legislative session.

We have also made great strides in recent years to build new coalitions and strengthen old ones. This session, we will be working with various interest groups, including but not limited to, Open Alliance, HomeCT, the Affordable Housing Coalition and others on the following proposals:

- ▶ Rewrite of (8-2) as described above
- ▶ Transparency for Municipal Plans of Conservation and Development. This proposal would require towns to publish their Plan of Conservation and Development (POCD) on the Office of Policy & Management (OPM) website.
- ➤ Creation of true incentives for towns to complete their POCD and develop protocol for review by OPM to ensure that towns comply with 8-23 affordable housing requirements
- ▶ Develop training curriculum and mandatory continuing education for planning and zoning commissioners to be implemented by 2022

As I've often stated in my short time as CEO of the HBRACT, there are many methods by which we can effectively advocate state government. In conjunction with my efforts as your lobbyist, your efforts are an important tool to move our agenda forward and promote our industry. I encourage you to get involved with our Government Affairs Committee.

#### Get to know your local legislators.

Meet them locally for coffee or bring them to a jobsite. Call, write and email them on matters of importance to you and your business. The better your personal relationships are with local officials the stronger and more effective our association will be. Should you need any assistance in facilitating a connection with your local legislators, please contact me for help.

#### Home Building Industry Day at the Capitol - March 16

Lastly, please consider joining us Monday, March 16th at the Legislative Office Building for Home Building Industry Day at the Capitol (HBID).

This year we will be joined by NAHB Chief Economist Dr. Robert Dietz who will present a CT Housing & Economic Forecast to our members, legislators, the administration and housing advocates. A big turnout by our membership will demonstrate to state government officials in attendance that we are organized and serious about making Connecticut a more hospitable place for residents to realize the American dream of homeownership. I strongly urge all who can to attend.

The legal battle over property takings began in 1999, when Connecticut developer, Eric Santini Sr. and NAHB sued the federal government to restore the full rights of property owners under the U.S. Constitution's 5th Amendment *Takings Clause*.

Twenty years later, in June 2019, attorney Timothy Hollister and NAHB won a landmark U.S. Supreme Court decision, restoring the right of property owners throughout the country to go directly to federal court when their property has been taken without just compensation. We owe both Tim Hollister and Eric Santini Sr. our deepest appreciation for the landmark Knick Decision.

#### 2019 HOBI Winners

This year's outstanding HOBI winners addressed their own land challenges with amazing skill and ingenuity, creating exquisite custom and spec homes on what would seem to be impossible building sites. And in an example of superb craftsmanship, gifted builder carpenter, Nick Sapia, restored an antique home to perfection, while replacing its entire foundation and framing.

#### **Top Trends of 2019**

On the interior of winning homes, we saw white washed walls with black framed openings, floating staircases and wine walls. Concrete was utilized for floors, counters, tile and sinks. Master baths featured free standing split vanities and curb less slab showers. Outdoor rooms were built with crushed lava rock and pea stone patios, and roof decks of all shapes and sizes continued to be in strong demand. It's clear that California has nothing on Connecticut!





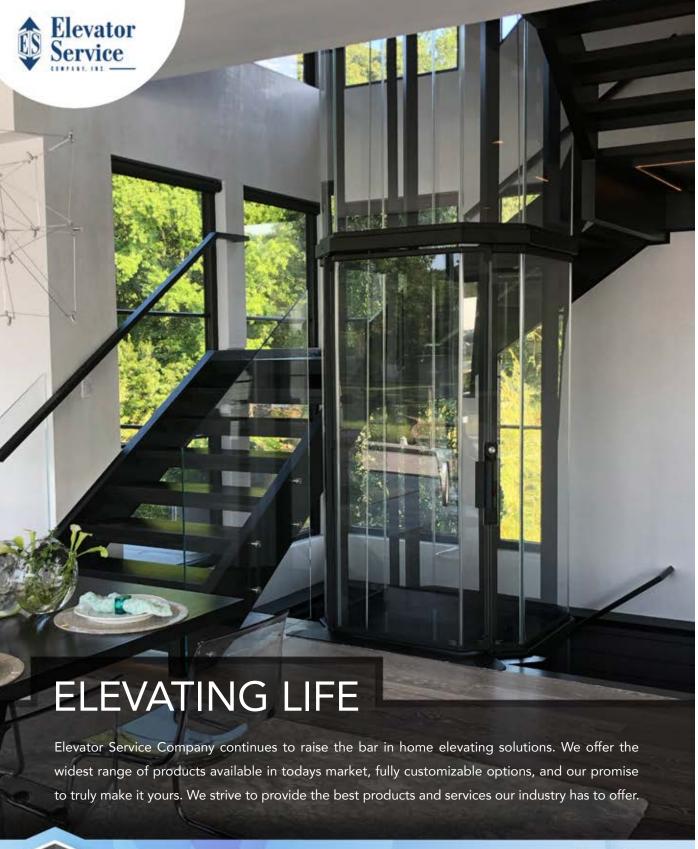




### BEST SPECIAL PURPOSE BUILDING MURPHY BROTHERS CONTRACTING

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




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
# OUTSTANDING CUSTOM HOME 5,000 – 6,000 SF SBP HOMES


# BEST SPEC HOME \$4-5 MILLION VITABUILT – VITA DESIGN GROUP

### TREC Builds A New In Town Luxury Spec Home In Greenwich



fter winning a 2019 HOBI Award for 307 Shore Road, ATREC is completing another luxury spec home in Greenwich, this one located in town at 179 North Maple.

Inspired by the classic homes of California, and completely furnished to provide the ultimate in-town living, the 6,000+sf WiFi smart home features seven bedrooms, six full and two half baths, a two car garage and a gated entrance with long driveway for privacy. The interior is designed with 10' ceilings and a double vault family room, and outdoor living amenities include an outdoor kitchen and pool site.

### Stamford's building boom shows no sign of slowing

The city keeps building — and selling — apartment towers. The \$90 million sale last month of the approximately 240-unit Infinity property in the South End's Harbor Point development marked the latest in a series of eight- and nine-figure deals in recent years. Those transactions highlight investor and tenant confidence in a segment of the housing market that is driving population growth and also expanding the base of potential buyers for single-family homes.

In recent years, Stamford has created far more housing units than any other town or city in the state, according to building permit data from the state Department of Economic Community Development and the U.S. Census Bureau.

From 2008 to 2017, the most recent year available, the city has issued permits for 4,341 housing units — nearly 2,000 more units than the next closest cities, Norwalk and Danbury. The bulk of those units are downtown and in the South End, where Harbor Point and developer Building and Land Technology have built nearly 3,000 units since 2007.

### Developers Add 1,655 Apartments in New Haven

New Haven's economy is set to expand by thousands of apartments, hundreds of hotel rooms, and a nearly \$1 billion new Yale neuroscience center in the coming years — if projects in the pipeline proceed as planned in 2020.

Acting Economic Development Administrator, Michael Piscitelli reported that private developers completed or began construction on over 1,655 new market-rate housing units in New Haven in 2019. The report states that another 1,937 market-rate units were also in the works as of October. Many of these new developments have been or are slated to be built atop surface parking lots.

Demand statewide for new housing is roughly 50,000 units by 2025, according to a study by the Connecticut State Data Center. That's a combination of affordable housing, and market-rate.



The Provincetown Pilgrim Monument is the tallest all-granite structure in the United States, and attracts over 100,000 tourists from around the world each year.



# The Power of Culture in your Business Ecosystem



very business has its own ecosystem, or different parts and systems that are symbiotic – they need each other to exist at top performance. When a cog is thrown into the ecosystem incorrectly, or if there is one part that isn't efficient, the whole system can breakdown fairly quickly.

A common thread in any business ecosystem is culture. Be it good or bad – it is there.

### What is Company Culture?

Company culture is a pre-existing condition. Employees don't bring it with them – it is created by the owner at the inception of the company. It can evolve and change, but it always must come from the top.

If one Googles "company culture", they will get varied definitions. Here at Di-Matteo Insurance, we define culture as a combination of vision, mission, how we interact with each other, how we interact with our customers, how we engage with our community, and the values we honor day to day both at work and in our personal lives.

I learned early on in my career as a business owner, manager, and leader that any shift in our delicate ecosystem quickly derailed forward moving progress.

### Is your company in a Culture **Crisis?**

I have often seen and worked with companies who are struggling with sales, high employee turnover and/or customer dissatisfaction. I've watched the leadership of these companies scrambling to find answers. Was their pricing off the mark? Was there new competition in their area? Were they in an economic downturn? The list went on. Where they often DON'T look is internally – was it their company culture that was a success roadblock? PS - it's often a big piece of the puzzle that prevents them from focusing on the other issues effectively.

Culture – good or bad – has a rippling effect that transcends a company. One bad ripple can quickly create a tsunami. Disgruntled employees will not deliver the best customer experience to your clients, revenues drop, and your NPS (Net Promoter Score - how willing your customers are to refer you to others. Low score means they won't refer, high score means they will recommend you) will suffer.

The good news – you can change. You can correct. You can start over. You can stop the waves from crippling your company.

### Five Steps to Creating a Dynamic Company Culture

If your company culture is less than ideal, you aren't alone. Very few business owners launch their companies and hone in on what their culture will be like from the start - in fact, most companies never do a deep dive into their culture until they hire a consultant to fix an ancillary problem.

Creating a shift in your culture takes time and patience, but the good news is it's a team effort, so you don't have to go it alone! Here are the simple five steps I used at DiMatteo to help us create a culture that led to low employee turnover with a "go team" atmosphere, improved customer engagement resulting in a high NPS score, and overall a great place to work.

Understanding your Purpose. You and your employees need to understand and FEEL that what you and they do matters and is important not only to your customers but to the overall well-being of the company. The receptionist is just as vital (if not more) than the president. Each employee is an important part of the ecosystem and has a voice. They need to understand the purpose, buy into the purpose, and live the purpose every single day.

Engagement of the Team. Back to the ecosystem, every employee needs to be able to work at peak efficiency and work well together within the team. Do you have the right team members in the right roles? Do you have good systems and processes in place to ensure everyone knows their jobs and they are productivity machines? Does your team communicate well with each other? The formula for success: Happy Employees = Happy Customers = Improved Profits - if you have great team engagement this is the basis for happy employees.

**Circle of Trust.** When you have a culture that fosters open communication where employees feel comfortable bringing ideas to the table and are allowed to challenge the status quo you are fostering innovation. Employees thrive in an environment of trust where there is transparency between the layers of management and within the team. As with all culture driven initiatives, this must come from the top. This is where hiring the right people is critical. Bringing someone onboard who does NOT fit the company culture will offset the ecosystem - specifically if this person puts a shadow on the circle of trust. Your employees must feel safe on all levels and the owner is the protector.

Foster Growth. You should always be training your successor, and everyone on your team should be doing the same. Removing the cutthroat, crawl up the ladder regardless of who you step over doesn't fly in a dynamic culture. At DiMatteo, we are in constant learning mode and always support an employee who wants to grow and move into new roles within our company. It's how we have grown as a business. It's important to identify WHAT the employee is great at but also what they really love to do. Foster their growth and allow them to have unlimited learning.

Live It. Culture building isn't one and done. It's more than bringing in a consultant to map out what your vision and mission is. Culture needs to be nurtured and every employee becomes part of the process. Remember culture is infectious, be it good or bad. The ripple effect is quite powerful. As the owner it's up to you to lead your team on the culture front. Be open, be honest, be transparent. Have regular team meetings and 1:1 sit-downs with employees where you do more listening than talking. Be open to ideas and change and be on the lookout for culture roadblocks – anything that shifts your ecosystem.

Remember, employees and customers will leave your brand not because of money but because of culture. When they don't

feel loved and appreciated, they will search for a company that fulfills those needs. Embrace your culture, nurture it and watch your ecosystem flourish.

# Make CT more accommodating to housing and businesses

### It's time to rewrite the confusing law that governs local zoning decisions

With the legislature's failure to pass House Bill 6749:
An Act to Reorganize the Zoning Enabling Act and to Promote Municipal Compliance in the 2019 session, Connecticut missed a great opportunity to spur economic development and address glaring issues of housing affordability, diversity and accessibility.

In general, passage of HB 6749 would have made Connecticut a more accommodating place to live and do business.

This bill would have rewritten the Connecticut Zoning Enabling Act (CGS 8-2) which currently reads like a multi-page run-on sentence. The Act is very challenging to read and understand, even for experienced attorneys. Consequently, the statutory requirements and limitations of the Zoning Enabling Act are mostly lost on laypersons who typically makeup local zoning commissions which are charged with the act's implementation.

This lack of clarity and understanding of the law leads to less predictability and creates a gray area in which the private sector does not excel. This murkiness in the law results in guess work by local planning and wetland commissions and, in turn, overburdens the appeals process and increases the use of litigation to determine the success of a development application.

There's a reason why Connecticut has more law firms that selfidentify as land-use experts than any other state as reported by the Brookings Institution and highlighted in an excellent article recently published by the Connecticut Mirror, titled, Separated by Design: How Some of America's Richest Towns Fight Affordable Housing.".

HB 6749 would have also eliminated the ability of a local planning and zoning commission to reject an affordable housing

application based on the current "character of the district." The "character of a district" or community is entirely too subjective and vague a term upon which to base zoning decisions and lends itself to misuse by local planning and zoning commissions. This critically important change would have brought more certainty to the permit application process.

Current law requires cities and towns to complete affordable housing plans. However, the law gives little direction to municipalities as to how to complete these plans or what the plans should contain or how compliance is to be determined. The law, as it is currently written, sets our towns up for failure and as such, many towns are currently non-compliant. HB 6749 would have compelled the Department of Housing (DOH) in conjunction with a newly formed working group to develop a format and provide guidance to towns with the plan drafting process. This would have been particularly helpful to small towns with limited resources and staff to put together a plan of this sort.

Rarely has a piece of legislation receive such wide support from a diverse array of interest groups including the Home Builders and Remodelers Association of Connecticut, The Connecticut Chapter of the American Planners Association, and housing advocacy groups including, but not limited to, the Partnership for Strong Communities, the Connecticut Fair Housing Center and the Connecticut Housing Coalition.

That is why our HBRA Government Affairs Committee has made advocating for the modernization of the Zoning Enabling Act CGA 8-2 our primary focus for the 2020 session.

If successful, this will create private sector construction jobs and encouraged economic growth in our state, but more importantly, it will afford more Connecticut residents the opportunity to work where they live by making it easier to address issues of housing diversity, affordability and accessibility.






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### **Lumber Market Update**

ince my last update nearly six months ago, lumber and panel prices have trended upward. The increases started out slowly, but in recent weeks have accelerated rapidly. Some are saying this is similar to the wild ride of 2018.

### What has happened?

Since September, Douglas Fir is up 9.1% after some small decreases through mid-October. KDSPF is up 9.8%. Douglas Fir plywood is up 3.9%, after falling through late

January. The gain since late January is 11.3%. OSB is up 18% after falling slightly through mid-October. KDSPF continues to be at a larger than normal discount of 19% to Douglas Fir. It's no surprise why so many builders continue to switch to KDSPF from Douglas Fir.

### Why has this happened?

Unlike last year there seems to be greater demand than supply this year. Housing starts are up and mill closure continue to occur. Although new mills in the south continue to come on line and increase production of Southern Yellow Pine, the wet winter in the south has reduced production more than it has reduced consumption. We seldom use SYP here in Connecticut except as treated lumber, but it is commonly used for framing in many other parts of our country.

#### **British Columbia**

The annual allowable cut and hence production is still dropping in B.C. This is an ongoing situation and will continue for years.

#### **Transportation**

Rail transportation has been severely disrupted in Canada as pipeline protesters have blockaded the Canadian National Railroad tracks in Ontario. This situation will probably be resolved by the time you read this, but at this time it is backing up trains across Canada.

#### **Imports**

Lumber imports continued to increase, primarily in European Spruce species. While these are generally very nice in appearance, strength varies significantly from species to species and all are weaker than domestic and Canadian KDSPF. Be sure to refer to the appropriate span tables if you use these. Imports of framing lumber are still insignificant compared to the volumes from Canada, however the volumes from Canada are dropping

### **Exports**

Exports from the U.S. are dropping, especially to China. Chinese tariffs on logs and lumber from the USA are having a big impact.

### **Conclusion**

By the time I write my next column in the Spring, I'll be able to tell you what happened. For now prices are rising, how long this lasts is anybody's guess.
